This album was recorded and mixed entirely in the analog domain. There were a number of factors that led to choosing analog over the newer and more widely used digital format. I should mention that I have extensive experience in both formats. Due to the nature of the music and the primarily acoustic instrumentation, the analog tape gives it a warmer and also clearer, more realistic sound. Additionally, since it was recorded almost entirely "live," there wasn't any need for the infinite amount of tracks that digital recording affords. Lastly, there was no need to correct or improve on the performances, which is the primary reason why most people seem to choose the digital format, working with computers to accomplish creating the final "performance." The analog format has worked 'just fine' since the days of Louis Armstrong onto The Beatles and through to the White Stripes. Don't fix it if it ain't broken!


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
